Dear Daughters and adults,

As we begin a new term and a new year, I look back at the events for our jurisdiction of the last couple of years and realize the blessings that we have had. Others might look at the time and think of it negatively, but for me, it has been a chance for unbridled opportunities. We have had a clean slate on which to write our history.

It is important that we take these opportunities and look at Oregon Job's Daughters with new eyes and enthusiasm. We are in a unique position to restructure our statewide youth programs and a group of Daughters has accepted this challenge. The Oregon Jobie Evolution was born on November 14 and on December 6, the Jobie Evolution Team (JET) made their first presentation to adults – the EGGC – and requested we have faith in their ideas and determination, and we allow them to propose changes that would be implemented immediately and further changes brought forward for Daughter consideration. It was with Faith the EGGC unanimously supported the Daughters' request and that I subsequently suspended the Grand Bethel bylaws.

It is equally important that we take this opportunity to embrace the changes that must be made by the Grand Guardian Council and by our Bethels. All but 1 Bethel initiated new members this fall term for a gain of at least 20-25 new members. I am anxious to see the annual reports to know with certainty how many new Daughters we have. It is only with the love of our Daughters who invite their friends to join them, and the support of the Bethel Guardian Councils that our jurisdiction will see growth, stability and success. It is only with strengthened Bethels that Oregon Job's Daughters will have its Charter fully reinstated.

Before we get to Grand Session 2010 there will be a wholly revised Manual of Rules and Regulations for the Grand Guardian Council for their review. The Vision 2015 report will demonstrate the diligent work of many adults, including the EGGC, and Daughters to provide the solid footing our jurisdiction needs to be strong in the future. Enhanced Bethel Guardian Council training will be completed and shared during upcoming official visitations. The Grand Bethel will hold its first statewide Jobie Congress and the Daughters will decide the direction of their own statewide programs.

It is clear that the determination of Oregon to remain a Grand jurisdiction is stronger than ever and I am thankful for the efforts by so many. For me, the blessings are abundant and continue to be placed before us for the taking. Take the opportunities before you, spread your wings, and remember that with Faith and love all things are possible!

Grand Guardian Ruling Not Contrary to Supreme Law

History:

On August 30, 2009, a proposal was made to explore ways to enhance or transform the statewide programs offered for Oregon Job's Daughters. On November 14, 2009, a small, representative group of Oregon Job's Daughters and adults met to discuss the statewide youth programs. From that meeting the Oregon Jobie Evolution was begun with five Daughters providing direction, gathering input and garnering support for a newly visioned Grand Bethel of Oregon. The Jobie Evolution Team, or JET, made a presentation to the Executive Grand Guardian Council on December 6, 2009. As a result of that historic presentation, the Executive Grand Guardian Council voted unanimously to support the efforts of the Oregon Jobie Evolution and to allow the work of the JET to move forward.

Ruling:

For the evolution of the Oregon Grand Bethel to continue, it became clear that the bylaws of the Grand Bethel of Oregon would need to be rewritten. To allow for the broadest possible latitude for our Daughters to affect change in the Oregon Grand Bethel, and with the support of the Executive Grand Guardian Council of Oregon, the Grand Bethel Bylaws, Rules and Regulations are hereby suspended.

Intent and Implementation of Ruling:

The Oregon Grand Bethel will not be without rules or oversight. Supreme Supplemental Instruction 19 provides for regalia for the Grand Bethel, but allows the remaining structure to be at the will of each jurisdiction. The Grand Bethel will be overseen by a newly appointed Youth Committee and governed by a Youth Advisory Board, the make-up of both are listed below.

One proposal made by the JET was to reduce the number of statewide events and to enhance the remaining events to make them more effective and more fun. As a result of this proposal, Grand Bethel weekend and statewide initiation will be combined into a single event known as March Madness held on March 6, 2010. In addition, the annual Grand Bethel Tea held at Jennings McCall in Forest Grove, which was postponed due to illness, will be cancelled for this Grand Bethel year. The Grand Bethel will meet at the Annual session of the Grand Guardian Council, held June 24-27, 2010 in Keizer, Oregon.

Another proposal provided for a progressive line for the Grand Bethel with the election of the Grand Bethel Senior Princess. This proposal will be presented to the Daughters at March Madness. If approved by the Daughters, the Grand Bethel will be allowed to elect both a Grand Bethel Honored Queen and Grand Bethel Senior Princess on March 6, 2010. The Youth Advisory Board with the assistance of the Youth Committee will provide each Bethel with more specific details of this and other proposals prior to the March meeting.

For the election of the Grand Bethel Honored Queen, the rules contained within the old Grand Bethel Bylaws shall be followed to the extent that they provide for a democratic and fair process. Similar rules shall be published to provide for an application process for Grand Bethel Senior Princess candidates so an election may be held in March if the proposal is approved by the Daughters. This means that a Daughter may apply to be a Grand Bethel Honored Queen and/or Grand Bethel Senior Princess candidate(s).

The proposed make-up of the Grand Bethel is outlined in a document presented to the Executive Grand Guardian Council and published on the Oregon Jobie website: www.oriojd.org. This proposal calls for the audition and selection of the Supreme Ritual Team at March Madness and that those Daughters selected for the team would become the next year's Grand Bethel Messengers. In support of this proposal, the auditions for the Supreme Ritual Team will be scheduled on March 6, and will be under the direction of the Youth Committee. Those chosen for the Supreme Ritual Team will not be designated as next year's Grand Bethel Messengers unless this proposal is adopted by the Daughters. If this designation passes, they would be installed at Grand Session in June 2010.

A final proposal that would impact the March 6 meeting would involve the Daughters' recommendations for adults to work with the Grand Bethel. There will be at least one proposal brought forward for Daughter consideration at March Madness. Adults interested in serving on the Youth Committee or working with the Grand Bethel are encouraged to submit letters of interest to the Youth Committee Chair by February 20, 2010.

Additional proposals as they are brought forward will be shared with the jurisdiction and presented to the Daughters for their approval. Proposed Grand Bethel Rules and Regulations will also be drafted by the Youth Advisory Board and Youth Committee to be submitted to the delegation at the Annual session of the Grand Guardian Council.

Dear Oregon Job's Daughters,

2010 will be an exciting year for Oregon Job's Daughters. Through the work of the Jobie Evolution Team, we will have the opportunity to consider changes that will radically affect the Grand Bethel of Oregon, and the Daughters who choose to serve there. Many of you have heard about these proposals in your Bethels, at meetings during the Fall Official Visits, or on Facebook in the discussion groups posted on the JET page. Some of you have not heard about these proposals. All of you will have an opportunity to comment on them and consider adopting them at the March Madness meeting of the Oregon Grand Bethel to be held at Statewide Initiation on Saturday, March 6th 2010.

One of the proposals you will be considering is the creation of a progressive line for Grand Bethel Honored Queen (GBHQ). This proposal would have the Grand Bethel elect a Senior Princess, who would serve for a year and be elected again the following year as GBHQ. This gives the Daughter a year to prepare, make better, stronger plans for her year, and establish her working relationships for success. It's an exciting prospect.

Should the Daughters of Oregon vote to elect the Grand Bethel Senior Princess (GBSP) during the March Madness meeting, the Grand Bethel would like to be prepared to offer a slate of candidates for this position as well as GBHQ. To accommodate this possibility, the Executive Grand Guardian Council has suspended the rules and regulations of the Grand Bethel in anticipation of any changes the Daughters may wish to make. The Grand Bethel Committee will be soliciting candidates for both the GBSP and the GBHQ, and will be prepared to move forward with the election based on the Daughter's decision at that time. The election of the GBHQ will precede the election of the GBSP, so interested Daughters may apply for one or both positions if they so desire.

If you are interested in becoming a GBSP candidate and/or a GBHQ candidate, now is the time to begin the process of nomination. If the Daughters decide to have a progressive line for the Grand Bethel, the GBSP for the 2010-2011 year will be elected at March Madness on March 6, 2010. Regardless of the outcome of that ballot, the GBHQ for the year 2010-2011 will be elected at that time as well. Both will be installed at Grand Session, June 25-27, 2010 in Keizer. Attached are the necessary forms to make application to become a GBSP or a GBHQ candidate. There are two (2) forms, FORM A-the candidate application form and FORM B-confidential approval form for Bethel Daughters and Executive Council members. These forms will work for either election process.

The Grand Bethel Committee has decided to use the rules and regulations that currently exist in the Grand Bethel as qualification guidelines for the 2010 election. These rules and regulations will apply to both the GBSP and the GBHQ candidates. The applicable rules read as follows, with additions for this year:

Section 1. Eligibility

- (a) A special group will be called “Grand Bethel Honored Queen Candidates” and “Grand Bethel Senior Princess Candidates.” Each Bethel may recommend as its candidates, its current spring term Honored Queen and/or any Past Honored Queens who are members in good standing, who have been in regular attendance for a period of six (6) months in the Bethel to be represented, unless excused by the Bethel Guardian. The Grand Bethel Honored Queen candidates shall be at least sixteen (16) and not yet twenty (20) years of age at the time of the first official business day of the Annual Session of the Grand Guardian Council. The Grand Bethel Senior Princess candidates shall be at least fifteen (15) and not yet nineteen (19) years of age at the time of the first official business day of the Annual Session of the Grand Guardian Council.

Section 2. Application

- (a) Each candidate will submit an application on the form approved by the Grand Bethel Committee. The form shall include: Candidate’s name, address, birth date, Bethel number and city and parent or legal guardian’s signature, supporting and approving her application.
- (b) Each candidate will submit her completed application to the Bethel Guardian Secretary who shall verify that the Daughter is a member in good standing.
- (c) Confidential approval forms shall be distributed by the Grand Bethel Committee. They shall be filled out by all Daughters and Executive Bethel Guardian Council members of the applicant’s Bethel present at a regular Bethel meeting no later than January 31st.
- (d) The application and the completed recommendation forms shall be placed in an envelope by the Bethel Recorder, sealed, signed across the seal and mailed by the Guardian Secretary to the Grand Bethel Guardian. Forms must be postmarked no later than February 5th to be considered.
- (e) The Grand Bethel Guardian shall send an acknowledgment to each applicant upon receipt of her completed application.
- (f) The Grand Bethel Committee shall review all applications and recommendations. If the majority of the recommendations sent by the Bethel members and the Executive Bethel Guardian Council members of the applicant’s Bethel approve the application, the Daughter will be a Grand Bethel Honored Queen candidate, a Grand Bethel Senior Princess candidate, or both as per her designation on the application.
- (g) The Grand Bethel Guardian shall notify the Daughter whether she will or will not be a Grand Bethel Honored Queen and/or a Grand Bethel Senior Princess candidate no later than February 20th.

Remember—these rules and regulations will apply for both the GBSP and the GBHQ candidates. We have also attached the Grand Bethel Honored Queen contract. This contract outlines the duties and responsibilities of the Grand Bethel Honored Queen, and should be reviewed by the Daughter and her parents prior to submitting for candidacy. This contract will be revised to cover the Grand Bethel Senior Princess as well, and both Daughters will need to agree to the terms set forth in the contract.

The Grand Bethel Committee wishes to encourage all eligible daughters who are interested in being a GBSP candidate or a GBHQ candidate to complete the application process as soon as possible. Do not delay and wait until the last minute. Please remember that ALL FORMS MUST be postmarked no later than February 5th, 2009 to be considered for application.

Performance Contract
Grand Guardian Council of Oregon

This contract is an agreement between the Grand Guardian Council, represented by the Grand Guardian (GG), the Youth Committee, represented by the Youth Committee Chair, the Grand Bethel Honored Queen (GBHQ) and her parents or guardians. This agreement outlines the duties and responsibilities of the Youth Committee and GBHQ in performing their many duties and how the program fits into the overall goals of Oregon Job's Daughters.

Recitals

1. The GB program was established in April 1951 under the authority of the Grand Guardian Council of Oregon.

2. Duties of the Grand Bethel Honored Queen are as follows:

Duties

- (a) It shall be the duty of the Grand Bethel Honored Queen to:
 - (1) preside at all meetings of the Grand Bethel
 - (2) appoint committees approved by the Youth Committee.
 - (3) preside over Congress and official ceremonies of the Grand Bethel.
 - (4) attend the Annual Session of the Grand Guardian Council and give a report of her activities during her term.
 - (5) conduct the election of the next Grand Bethel Line Officers.
 - (6) oversee the appointment of the Grand Bethel Officers.
 - (7) whenever possible, visit Bethels and other Daughter related activities to promote the good of the Order.
 - (8) be the "official" representative of Job's Daughters and give appropriate remarks at the Annual Session of the Grand Lodge and other Masonic affiliated bodies, when invited to do so and upon the approval of the Grand Guardian or the Grand Bethel Guardian.
 - (9) if possible, attend the Annual Session of the Supreme Guardian Council.
- (b) The Grand Bethel Honored Queen shall present an accounting to the Youth Committee for reimbursement on a monthly basis, and at the close of the term showing the grand total of money spent in the course of her duties.

Agreement

- 1. The GGC has the following responsibilities:
 - a. The Grand Guardian shall appoint a Youth Committee as long as there is sufficient interest in the program by qualified Daughters and adults.
 - b. Adults who are appointed to serve on the committee must be CAV.
 - c. Adopt a budget at the annual session of the GGC to provide for programs, and as may be recommended by the Youth Committee.
- 2. The responsibilities of the Youth Committee include:
 - a. Oversee the GB program.
 - b. Plan and promote the activities of the GB, including GB weekend and annual GB session at GGC's Grand Session.
 - c. Approve the travel plans and chaperones for the GBHQ's travel.
 - d. Oversee the fund-raising efforts made on behalf of the GB program.
 - e. Seek authorization for expenses prior to any commitment of funds.
 - f. Meet at least quarterly, but as often as deemed necessary by the Youth Committee Chair and the Grand Guardian.
- 3. The Grand Bethel Honored Queen shall:
 - a. Work harmoniously with Miss Oregon Job's Daughter, the Grand Bethel and the GGC.

- b. Represent Job's Daughters at the request of the Grand Guardian or Youth Committee. If she is unable to attend an event, the GB Sr. Princess may be requested to represent the Grand Bethel, along with MOJD representing Oregon.
 - c. Provide the Youth Committee Chair with a monthly itinerary of her proposed travel schedule prior to any travel ensuing.
 - d. Provide the Youth Committee Chair with a list of chaperones approved by her parents that may be considered for chaperoning at various activities throughout the year.
 - e. Request approval for a designated chaperone for each event at which GBHQ is present and provide details of how the GBHQ will travel to and from the event.
 - f. Submit monthly expense reports, requesting reimbursement for authorized expenses upon presentation of receipts no later than the month following the expense.
 - g. Obtain approval of the Youth Committee Chair prior to making any expenditure on behalf of the GB program or for which GBHQ or her parents have an expectation to be reimbursed.
 - h. Work cooperatively with the members of the Youth Committee.
4. The responsibilities of the parents of the Grand Bethel Honored Queen include:
- a. Support for their daughter financially, logistically and emotionally. Being Grand Bethel Honored Queen is a challenging leadership opportunity for any young woman.
 - b. The parents and GBHQ are responsible for the travel arrangements of the GBHQ. Approval for travel must be obtained prior to travel beginning and before any financial obligation is incurred.
 - c. The parents shall work with the GBHQ to provide the Youth Committee Chair with a list of acceptable chaperones from which the Youth Committee Chair may designate specific chaperone responsibilities for any given engagement. This list may be amended by either the parents or the Youth Committee Chair, but the final approval for a chaperone rests with the Youth Committee Chair. Inclusion on the list of chaperones does not guarantee that a specific chaperone will be approved for any event.
 - d. The parents shall provide for the financial needs of their daughter during her term of office. Some of these expenses may qualify for reimbursement, upon approval of the Youth Committee and Finance Committee.
5. Travel arrangements:
- a. All travel arrangements must be approved by the Youth Committee Chair.
 - b. Travel shall be reimbursed only as provided by the Youth Committee and in the adopted budget.
 - c. All chaperones for GB shall be at least 25 years of age.
 - d. GBHQ may not drive any other Job's Daughters / youth to or from or between Job's Daughter events.
 - e. All out of jurisdiction travel must be approved in writing by the Youth Committee chair and the Grand Guardian.
 - f. The housing arrangements for GBHQ when traveling overnight, shall be approved by the Youth Committee Chair.
6. Property of the GB program - The Grand Bethel Honored Queen program has property that is passed down from GBHQ to GBHQ, much of which has significant monetary and sentimental value.
- a. Each GBHQ and her parents shall inventory the property given to them on the night of installation (or soon thereafter), noting the condition of the property and acceptance of the property and responsibility of same.

- b. The Official Regalia of the GB shall not be altered or embellished without specific written authorization by the Youth Committee Chair and Grand Guardian.
- c. The GBHQ shall adhere to the GBHQ / MOJD dress code and expectations.
- d. The GB program may have various items to sell from time to time. The GBHQ and her parents will be asked to fully participate in all fund-raising activities on behalf of the GB and are responsible for any property they take to use for promotion and/or fund-raising.
- e. In addition it is tradition that each GBHQ may offer pins/charms for sale during their year of service. These pins/charms shall be ordered by the Youth Committee Chair after consultation with the current GBHQ and approval of the Finance Committee.
 - i. The payment for the pins/charms may be direct to the vendor or by reimbursement to the parents.
 - ii. The funds raised from the sale of the pins/charms shall be turned over to the GB Committee at least monthly.
 - iii. If requested by the GB Guardian, funds and/or pins/charms shall be turned over immediately. Funds in excess of \$100 shall be turned over immediately to the Youth Committee.

Other provisions: TBD

I / we agree to the provisions of this contract and the various policies, procedures and requirements as further outlined in the Bylaws of the Grand Bethel and the attached documents.

Daughters and Adults of Oregon:

The Jobie Evolution Team has been hard at work, making recommendations for changing the structure of the Grand Bethel, and the adult infrastructure that supports both the Grand Bethel and Miss Oregon Job's Daughter committees. This year has provided us with an opportunity to test the new structure of the Committee, now named the Youth Committee. The adult members are:
